**BEFORE WE BEGIN:** What was your takeaway from this past Sunday's sermon?

**DOCTRINE: God the Holy Spirit:** We believe that the Holy Spirit is a Divine Person with God the Father and God the Son and of the same nature; who was active in creation and who glorifies the Lord Jesus Christ. He is also called Counselor and convicts of sin, righteousness and judgment. He bears witness to the truth of the gospel and is the agent of the new birth. He intercedes for believers as well as seals, guides, teaches, witnesses, sanctifies, and empowers believers for godly living and service. Genesis 1:2; John 14:16-17; 16:5-15; Romans 8:9-11; 1 Corinthians 3:16 (West Side Articles of Faith)

**ATTRIBUTE OF GOD/JESUS: Holiness** - Within the box or chest that was the Ark of the Covenant, were the stone tablets of the law that had been given to Moses on Mt. Sinai. The Ark was the repository of the written expression of the moral character of God. It was a constant reminder that God was holy-a morally excellent, perfect being, totally other than man, with purity of being in every aspect- and that breaking His law was an affront to His nature and a rebellion against His rightful rule. (Leviticus 19:2; Job 34:10; Isaiah 47:4 and Isaiah 57:15.) (James Montgomery Boice and Precept Upon Precept.)

**DAY 1 Read Luke 6:1-11**

1. What was at the heart of the controversy between Jesus and the Pharisees regarding the Sabbath?
2. Considering Jesus' claim in vs. 5, to what were the Pharisees blinded?
3. What was the motive behind the Pharisee's actions in vs. 6-7?
4. What action did Jesus take and what principle was he revealing?
5. What warning is there for us today?

**DAY 2 Read Luke 6:12-19**

1. For what do you think Jesus prayed? How would your life change if prayer were a daily priority?
2. Explain the difference between a disciple and an apostle. Can you think of reasons Jesus chose 12 apostles?

3. From verses 17-19, what did Jesus do before He preached His sermon?

**DAY 3 Read Luke 6:20-38; Acts 1:8; Galatians 5:22**

1. Define the word "Blessed."
2. Read verses 20-26 and explain how they relate to us today.
3. What does Jesus focus on in verses 27-38?
4. How does the Holy Spirit empower a believer to obey God's word?
5. For what will you ask the Holy Spirit this week?

**DAY 4 Read Luke 6: 39-45; Romans 7:6**

1. What is God revealing to you as you prayerfully read these verses?
2. What is the warning in verses 43-45?
3. What does the phrase, "for the mouth speaks what the heart is full of" (v. 45) mean to you personally?

**DAY 5 Review Luke 6:1-45 and read Luke 6:46-49, John 14:23-26**

1. Jesus wants us to have a proper understanding of the things of God in this chapter. Do you rejoice when God is honored? Do you enjoy worshipping God or do you have a casual approach to the things of God?
2. Do you have a desire to build your life for God's kingdom or for your kingdom? Will you prayerfully ask God to give you His desires? Share the results with your group.
3. Share new insights God has given you in this chapter as you studied these foundational principles of Christ.
